

THE SEMINAR: A New GPS Greg Psaltis, DDS

This course is intended for dentists of all ages and experience. The concept is to first determine where each attendee is in terms of future years still to be in practice and the level of satisfaction with his/her practice. By placing oneself on a bi-axial grid, each course participant will be able to understand how strongly to focus on specific areas of interest in four areas that will propel them to heightened security in their professional life, as well as the four categories for boosting personal career satisfaction. The bases of the concepts are from both actual life experiences as well as materials on broader quality of life issues. The course will have an appeal to dentists newly out of training, those with many years of experience and everyone in between. While the material is largely geared toward dentists, the concepts are sufficiently universal that any member of the dental team will glean much from the presentation.

ST. PETERSBURG, RUSSIA- Peter the Great called St. Petersburg his "Window on Europe." For openers, there's the fabulous Hermitage Museum at the Winter Palace, with its renowned art collection from Raphael to Rembrandt, Titian to Tintoretto. Other musts are the babbling fountains of Peterhof, and the Amber Room at Catherine's Palace. With two full days you'll have opportunity to "see it all." (Note: For any ship sponsored shore excursion you purchase, your Russian visa will be included. If you plan to tour "on your own," you will need to arrange for a Russian Visa through the Russian Embassy prior to departing. (Touring on your own is not recommended in St. Petersburg unless you've been there before, speak Russian or know someone there who can escort you.)

HELSINKI, FINLAND- Shaped by its bays and off-shore islands, Helsinki is one of Europe's most scenic capitals. Walk along the waterfront to explore the outdoor fish and flower markets, walk the esplanade shopping streets, hear a Sibelius concert, visit the iconic Temppeliaukio Church or any one of a number of fascinating museums. You'll find terrific shopping opportunities here.

STOCKHOLM, SWEDEN- There's so much to see in charming Stockholm, sprawled on 18 islands, often called the "Venice of the North." Cruise the sparkling waterways and navigate narrow, medieval streets. Watch the snappy changing of the guard at the Baroque Royal Palace and sail into Viking history with a visit to the awesome Vasa Museum.

WARNEMUNDE, GERMANY- is the "jumping-off-spot" for a quick trip down to Berlin. Inseparable from its modern history, Berlin decidedly features it. In the former Soviet/American/British sectors are the Berlin Cathedral, Checkpoint Charlie, Unter den Linden Boulevard and the stunning Brandenburg Gate.

KIEL, GERMANY- is an important sea transport hub and only 56 miles north of Hamburg, Germany's second largest city and a must-see on your itinerary. Don't miss the magnificent St. Michael's Church. Then visit the "Speicherstadt" warehouse district

with its Wilhelminian brick Gothic buildings, unusual gables and little towers.
