- pathological conditions, left untreated, can limit substantially a child's an individual's development
- 16 and quality of life an individual's participation in life activities. An individual should be considered to
- 17 have a dental disability if pain, infection, or lack of stable and functional dentition:
- Restricts nutritional intake necessary for growth and energy needs.
- Delays or otherwise alters growth and development.
- Inhibits participation in life activities.
- Diminishes quality of life.
- Therefore, an individual should be considered to have a dental disability if orofacial pain, infection,
- pathological condition, and/or lack of functional dentition affect nutritional intake, growth and
