## **Council Charges**

#### Discussions

Council on Membership and Membership Services, Committee on Early Career Pediatric Dentists

- Charge to update the "Guide for Early Career Pediatric Dentists." The Committee would like to develop a toolkit, like the Safety Toolkit, under this charge, rather than an "FAQ" section.
- The Board supported this direction of the charge.

Council on Membership and Membership Services, Pediatric Dental Resident Committee

- The residents have found a mentoring program (Michigan Dental Association) they really like. They want to look at mentoring programs. If the board agrees, they'll move forward with developing a charge.
- Currently, the mentoring program works through Annual Session registration. Members are asked if they want to be a mentor, and they are matched to a list of residents. The results are uneven. While there are always more mentees than mentors, many residents are not aware that there is a program. The committee envisions a match based on interests rather than just availability.

Council on Membership and Membership Services, Committee on Early Career Pediatric Dentists

• Speakers at the Early Career Course do not get paid.

• Per the Administrative Policy and Procedure Manual, speakers get complimentary registration and hotel for their speaking days, but that's only for half or full day programs; the new format for the Early Career Course doesn't fall into that category. (Part of the idea for shorter speaking gigs is to allow people to see whether the speaker does well. If they do, they can get the longer gigs.)

The board noted that the issues brought up by these committees indicates a misdirect in what is being communicated. We need to figure out where they're not getting the information that's out there.

Council on Clinical Affairs, Committee on Special Health Care Needs

- The Committee wants to be charged to develop a symposium on special needs.
- Historically, the board has decided whether a symposium is needed and builds the program.
- The Committee will propose a symposium at the next board meeting and get the charge at that point.
