Assessment of the Specialty

 Important to assess the strengths and weaknesses related to government advocacy

Capitalize on the strengths

Minimize any weaknesses



Strengths of the Specialty

- Credibility
 - Experts in pediatric care
 - Access to Care
 - Reports and Recommendations Carry Weight
 - State associations are not scientific bodies
- Respect
 - Colleagues
 - Legislators



Weaknesses for the Specialty

Limited number of pediatric dentists

Limited time and resources

 Limited exposure with state association on governmental affairs issues



Maximizing the Strengths

- Continue Access & Education Campaigns
 - Involve state association when possible

- Continue Recommendations and Studies
 - Communicate results to state association
 - Communicate results to policymakers



Minimizing the Weaknesses

Working well with state associations can:

Neutralize or eliminate weaknesses

 Turn weaknesses into strengths for you, the specialty and the profession



Become a Trusted Resource

- Foster Communication
 - Invite state association leaders and staff to board meetings
- Provide rapid response to state association
 - Legislative issues arise unexpectedly and require immediate attention
 - Information and guidance needed in days or hours, not months
 - Establish a mechanism act quickly



Get Involved in State Association

State associations need volunteers

- Most states have no limitations on the number of specialists involved
- Opportunities at all levels
 - Committees
 - Task Forces
 - House of Delegates



Make Volunteer Efforts Count

- Live up to commitments
 - Attend and participate in meetings
 - Don't over extend

- Advance in state association leadership
- Decision-makers
 - House of Delegates
 - Board of Directors or Executive Committees



Get to Know Staff

 State associations have limited staff members who wear many hats

 Utilize other services provided by state associations to develop rapport with staff

Staff needs reliable sources of information



Coordinate Message

- Political Realities:
 - State association leads in dental advocacy
 - Timing is everything
- Discuss issues directly with association
 - Legislators will ask for position and input of association
- Adapt to the circumstances presented
 - Accomplish what you can when you can
 - Don't waste resources on issues that aren't ripe for action



Coordinate Message

Political Action Committees

- Work as part of state association PAC board
- Coordinate with state association when possible to maximize benefit to both organizations





Be a Grassroots Activist

Be Proactive

- Participate in state lobby day
 - Recruit colleagues to participate
- Host a fundraiser for a candidate or PAC

- Invite legislators on office tour
 - Invite state association lobbyist/leaders



Be an Effective Grassroots Advocate

When talking with legislators, remember:

- 1) Legislators know nothing about dentistry
- 2) Keep message simple and on point
- 3) Work within time constraints 10 min.
- 4) Ask for a commitment on the issue
- 5) If they commit, thank them and...
