Dr. Heber Simmons, Jr.

Pediatric Dentist of the Year

Dr. Heber Simmons, Jr. has devoted his career to improving children's oral health. Heber was a practicing pediatric dentist in Jackson, Mississippi for over 57 years, retiring just this past year. In addition to running a busy practice and positively influencing the lives of so many children in Mississippi, he has also made a tremendous impact as an advocate for children.

Since 1997, Dr. Simmons has served as the AAPD's Congressional Liaison. He has taken time out of his busy schedule, roughly once a month whenever Congress is in session, to travel to Washington, D.C. to educate members of Congress and their staff concerning oral health issues for children. Through this effort, many on Capitol Hill have gotten to know Dr. Simmons- whom everyone just calls Heber- very well. They appreciate his passion, persistence, and persuasiveness regarding the importance of children's oral health and the effective federal investments that have made a real difference. This year Heber is officially retiring as Congressional Liaison, but will continue to serve as Special Consultant to the AAPD Board of Trustees.

Over the past year, Heber completed his Congressional Liaison service with aplomb, despite the challenges of the COVID pandemic. He helped train and orient the AAPD's incoming Congressional Liaisons, Drs. Warren Brill and Jade Miller. He helped obtain funding of \$12 million for pediatric dentistry training in both fiscal years 2020 and 2021, which resulted in new grant cycles for post-doctoral training and dental faculty loan repayment (with a preference for pediatric dentistry faculty). He spearheaded efforts that led to re-introduction of legislation to make dental faculty loan repayment non-taxable to individual recipients. He worked on a collegial and non-partisan basis with Members of Congress on both sides of the aisle.

Heber is a distinguished leader in dentistry, having served as President of the AAPD, the American Academy of Dental Practice Administration, and the Mississippi Dental Association. Heber received the AAPD's Ann Page Griffin Humanitarian Award in 2011 and the Distinguished Service Award in 1994. He was awarded an AAPD Presidential Citation in 2001 in recognition of his successful efforts in obtaining funding for the Title VII pediatric dentistry program. Thanks to his advocacy, that funding has continued to this day. Heber has served on the Board of Trustees of the American Dental Association (ADA), and has been an ADA dental consumer spokesperson since 1981, making numerous media appearances.



Heber received his dental degree at the University of Tennessee and completed his pediatric dentistry training there as well. In 2017 his alma mater created The Heber Simmons, Jr. D.D.S., M.S, Endowed Professorship of Pediatric Dentistry, to honor a man who has made a lifetime of contributions to the field.

Heber is not only an advocate for children, but also a trusted advisor on pediatric dental issues and a true friend to many on Capitol Hill. Among his many talents, Heber is a wonderful photographer. Many offices on Capitol Hill are graced with his efforts. It is also amazing that so many former patients of Heber's have spent time working on Capitol Hill as adults. Heber's energy and passion for people is contagious!

Heber's long-time pediatric dentist practice partner in Jackson, Miss., Dr. Joseph Young says:

"Heber and I practiced pediatric dentistry together for 33 years, and it was one of the greatest blessing of my life. He was not only a great mentor, but also a loving and compassionate friend to me. His daily examples of integrity and life lessons about "doing the right thing", guided our every practice decision. He put the patients' needs as the top priority and never refused anyone who needed his healing touch. The specialty of pediatric dentistry has been forever improved because of his dedication to the oral health of children."

Dr. David K. Curtis, pediatric dentist in Columbus, Miss., and a past president of both the American Academy of Pediatric Dentistry (AAPD) and the AAPD Foundation, says:

"Heber is an icon in pediatric dentistry, and dentistry at large. He has been a leader on the national stage for many decades. Heber has been a mentor to so many people, it is impossible to calculate. That would include me. Heber taught me so much about the nuance of politics, the importance of speaking the truth, and being authentic. Heber will be missed on Capitol Hill, as he is the best-known non-lobbyist in Washington. Heber's sign off at each visit was always, "We're just trying to take care of the children. If you can help us accomplish that it would be great." Well done Heber, well done!"

Thank you Heber, for helping to take care of the children and leaving the woodpile a lot higher than you found it!



This will be a lively presentation about basic pediatric dental trauma drawn from my experiences as a general practice dental resident in a Level I trauma center that was highly surgical in nature, as a pediatric dental resident in a similar setting, and in my 20 years as a clinical pediatric dentist and dental educator. We will explore trauma from the "outside in" and "top down" using some examples taken from personal patient care experiences. For some, this will be an all too familiar review. For others, this will shed light on unfamiliar territory.

You will learn about caring for injuries to extra and intraoral soft tissues, minor alveolar housing fractures, and the five major traumatic dental injuries: concussion, intrusion, extrusion, lateral luxation, and the "missing" tooth. We will discuss open vs. closed root apices, pulpal exposures and near exposures, and splinting techniques. The timing and treatment all of these injuries is especially challenging in the pediatric population and the need to go to the office or the emergency room will be addressed.

To conclude, we will review post-trauma care: timing of splint removal and endodontic therapy, diet, hygiene, and have a brief look at antibiotics and analgesics for pediatric patients. After this session, you will feel confident in your recognition and management of common pediatric dental traumas. Most importantly, you will be able to help families in their moment of need with expertise and compassion.

Tools that enhance patient compliance and safety will be provided along with details about drug interactions important in dental pain control.

Pediatric Orthodontics and Sleep Apnea: Which is Right and Which is an Illusion? 4 - 4:45 PM CDT Mitchell R. Levine, D.M.D., M.S.

Following an introduction to sleep anatomy and physiology ,the presentation will then provide a short primer on OSA to bring the participant up to speed. The presentation will address anatomical considerations of OSA including the site and nature of pharyngeal collapse associated with POSA. Their is a deeper device into the physiology of the airway as it relates to sleep apnea. A Review of the natural course of pediatric obstructive sleep apnea is provided, including the implications of dental arch expansion and extractions to allow for the participant to understand the potential implications of either. The presentation leans heavily on science to help the participant wade through premise that i orthodontic therapy may be be causally linked to obstructive sleep apnea. Eventually, the participant will need draw their own conclusions a determine which is right and which is an illusion.

Lessons Learned from the Pandemic

A novel coronavirus of unknown origin, named Severe Acute Respiratory Syndrome Coronavirus 2 (SARS-CoV-2), was identified in the Hubei province of China at the end of 2019. The disease caused by SARS-CoV-2 was named Coronavirus Disease-19 (COVID-19). The manifestations of COVID-19 are variable and significantly affected by age. Children typically present asymptomatic or mild symptoms. The elderly, in comparison, can experience a more severe course of the disease and significantly higher rates of illness and death. Since its origin, the viral infection spread rapidly to the rest of the earth and the World Health Organization announced a Public Health Emergency of International Concern in mid-March 2020. At present, COVID-19 is treated with antiviral drugs that improve the symptoms but do not affect mortality. The existing evidence indicates that the viral load is predominantly elevated in saliva and the oropharynx. Thus, dentists are particularly at risk of getting COVID-19 if they encounter an infected individual. The main purpose of this presentation is to provide an overview of the virus characteristics, pathogenicity, and infectious pathways.

The American Academy Pediatrics (AAP) Section on Oral Health Session is designed for all AAPD attendees. This session will address three aspects of structural racism and their contributions to negative child and adult health outcomes. The session will also explore root causes and other factors contributing to racial/ethnic child health disparities in the context of current trends in infant care practices and adolescent development, and identify ways in which policies support closure of these gaps. The session will promote interprofessional advocacy for children and families and boost communication skills and confidence for pediatric providers and other medical and dental professional team members when addressing the effects of racism on children and adolescents.

She received her certificate in pediatric dentistry from Children's National Medical Center. She is involved in teaching, clinical practice, research and holds grants in community advocacy.

Dr. Nia Heard-Garris is a pediatrician and a physician-investigator at the Ann & Robert H. Lurie Children's Hospital of Chicago and in the Department of Pediatrics at Northwestern University Feinberg School of Medicine. She examines the influence of social adversities experienced in childhood and subsequent child and adolescent health. Dr. Heard-Garris is also interested in the factors that contribute to a child's ability to thrive despite these experiences. In August 2019, she received her career development award (K01), which is funded by the National Heart Lung and Blood Institute and with this award she plans to investigate adolescent cardiometabolic health. She believes in using research to better

inform clinical practice and policy that supports children, their families, and their communities. Dr. Heard-Garris is also an active member in the American Academy of Pediatrics (AAP) and serves as the Chair and founding member of the Section of Minority Health, Equity, and Inclusion.

Dr. Heard-Garris completed a prestigious Robert Wood Johnson Foundation Clinical Scholars Fellowship at the University of Michigan. She earned her Master of Science in Health and Healthcare Research. She received her Doctor of Medicine (MD) from Howard University College of Medicine and helped to launch the student-run free clinic serving DC residents. Dr. Heard-Garris earned her Bachelor of Science in biology at Spelman College in Atlanta, Georgia. Dr. Heard-Garris has had numerous media appearances, including CNN/Sesame Street, NPR, NBC, and numerous others. Dr. Heard-Garris, her husband, and 7-year old son live in Chicago and as new Chicagoans they better understand the phrase "winter is coming."

Dr. Nita Mosby Tyler is the Chief Catalyst and Founder of The Equity Project, LLC – an organization designed to support organizations and communities in building diversity, equity and inclusion strategies and The HR Shop, LLC - a human resources firm designed to support non-profits and small businesses. She is the former Senior Vice President and Chief Inclusion Officer for Children's Hospital Colorado – the first African American woman to hold that position in the organizations 100+ year history. She is also the former Executive Director of the Office of Human Resources for the City and County of Denver – the first African American woman to hold that position in the 63+ year history of the agency. Dr. Mosby Tyler, a consultant accredited by the Georgetown University National Center for Cultural Competence and recipient of the Cornell University Diversity & Inclusion certification, is nationally recognized for her equity work with non-profit, community, government and corporate organizations.

Dr. Mosby Tyler holds a doctorate in the field of Organizational Leadership from the University of Colorado, a Master of Arts degree in Management from Webster University and a Bachelor of Science degree in Education from the University of Alabama.

Stay Safe, Stay Well: Managing Occupational Hazards in a Post-COVID World PD, DT

Your practice has been hit not only by the COVID-19 pandemic, but also may have been touched by such disasters as fires, hurricanes, urban destruction and their resultant economic and social effects. Our understanding of the effects of these cumulative disasters may take years, but some immediate lessons learned, actions to prepare us for the next disaster, and how practices have adapted would benefit pediatric dentists now. Managing the next crisis effectively can lead to enhanced safety for patients, more trust and motivation from staff, and a guicker economic rebound for your practice.

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In addition, the efforts to protect dental healthcare professionals from occupational exposure to pathogenic microorganisms continue to include the application of Standard-and Transmission-based Precautions. These remain the foundations for effective infection prevention in clinical settings. The current COVID-19 pandemic has necessitated a review and update of PPE and other infection control strategies that were used before emergence of SARS-CoV-2.

Presentations will discuss recent science-based CDC recommendations and OSHA regulations as they relate to suggested PPE and air quality modifications in dental practices. Special attention will be given to such COVID-related concerns as spatter and aerosols, increased exposure to surface disinfectants, chronic hypoxia from N-95 masks, and more. Members will leave the program equipped to take on current and future safety challenges with a risk-assessment checklist and a cornucopia of information.

Upon completion, attendees will be able to:

- Understand infection control precautions resulting from the COVID-19 pandemic.
- Comprehend the rationale for application of Transmission Precautions as important second tier infection prevention practices for Standard Precautions.
- Implement updated CDC and OSHA infection control updates into dental practice.
- Clinical lessons learned from COVID19. Aerosols, supply chains and maintaining a Positive Mental Attitude.

Dr. Molinari is Professor Emeritus at the University of Detroit Mercy School of Dentistry, where he served for 32 years as Chairman of Biomedical Sciences and Director of Infection Control. He has also been Director of Infection Control at Dental Advisor in Ann Arbor, Michigan, where he was involved in research studying new infection control technologies and products. He has published over 500 scientific articles, reports, and chapters in the areas of microbiology and immunology, and lectures nationally and internationally on topics dealing with infectious diseases and infection control. He has served as a consultant for the CDC, ADA Councils on Scientific Affairs and Dental Practice, and hospitals in the areas of infectious disease and infection control. Dr. Molinari was chairman of the State of Michigan Governor's Risk Reduction and AIDS Policy Commission, as well as a member of the Michigan Board of Dentistry. He is also co-author of the text Cottone's Practical Infection Control in Dentistry.

Dr. Casamassimo received his dental degree from Georgetown University in 1974 and a Master of Science and Certificate in Pediatric Dentistry from the University of Iowa in 1976. He has taught at the University of Iowa College of Dentistry (1976-78), the University of Colorado School of Dentistry (1978-88). He is Editor Emeritus of AAPD, and also a past-president of the specialty. He has authored or edited over 450 publications. His research interests include oral health of children and adults with special health care needs, health services research, and oral health disparity and he has received numerous private and public grants and contracts. Dr. Casamassimo is a fellow of the Royal College of Surgeons (Edinburgh) and the American Academy of Pediatric Dentistry. Dr. Casamassimo was the 2002 recipient of the AAPD Distinguished Service Award and in 2003, was honored by the Ohio Dental Association with its Humanitarian Award. In 2006, he received the Merle C. Hunter Award for Service from AAPD and in 2007, the AAPD Manuel Album Award for his work with patients with special needs. He is a 2007 recipient of Nationwide Children's Hospital Career Contribution Award. In 2012, he was named Pediatric Dentist of the year. In 2017 he was the Ohio Dental Association's Distinguished Dentist and was

awarded the ADA's Norton M. Ross Award for clinical research. In 2016, he was named Ron Bell Mentor of the Year by the College of Diplomates of the American Board of Pediatric Dentistry.

Dr. Casamassimo practices at Nationwide Children's Hospital where he was medical staff president in 1999. He is Past-President of the Ohio Dental Association and Chief Policy Officer of AAPD. He and his wife, Maureen, are proud parents of Katie, Shane, and Jess and reside in Columbus, Ohio.

Dr. Charles Czerepak is a pediatric dentist at Pine Dental Care in Chicago. He is an attending dentist at the Ann and Robert Lurie Children's Hospital and an assistant clinical professor at Northwestern University Feinberg School of Medicine. He has served on the Board of Trustees of the AAPD and the Illinois State Dental Association. He currently serves on the Medicaid Advisory Committee of the ADA and the Pediatric Dental Medicaid and CHIP advisory committee of the AAPD. He also sits on the ADA Safety Advisory Group and the AAPD Safety Committee.

Thomas S. Terranova joined AAAASF as Executive Director in April 2019, after serving as a corporate attorney at Greenberg Traurig, LLP. Trauma Guideline Update PD

Traumatic dental injuries occur frequently in children and adolescents, and management following a traumatic dental injury can be difficult for the patient and the dental team. The International Association of Dental Traumatology (IADT) updated the guidelines on management of acute traumatic dental injuries in 2020. These revised guidelines are based on best available evidence and adherence to them are intended to maximise the probability of a favourable outcome following a dental injury. This presentation will review the updated guidelines, explain the rationale for, and refer to the evidence for statements and decisions made in this 2020 revision. Controversial areas will be addressed and discussed. The structure of the guidelines and their use as reference will be explained. The goal is to update the clinician on the knowledge base on the emergency management of traumatic dental injuries and to demonstrate the format of the guidelines. Paediatric dentists have an important role to play in the appropriate management of the child patient who presents with a traumatic dental injury.

- Understand the structure of the guidelines.
- Be knowledgeable in the healing potential of oral tissue following injury.
- Understand the scientific rationale for the management of acute dental injury in primary and permanent dentitions.

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Professor Anne C O'Connell is a Board Certified pediatric dentist and a fellow of the AAPD and IADT, and Head of Paediatric Dentistry in Trinity College, Dublin. She is currently the President of the International Association of Dental Traumatology. O'Connell trained in pediatric dentistry at Eastman Dental Center, N.Y., and a further degree in Cariology from the University of Rochester, New York. O'Connell has held academic positions at the Eastman Dental Center, the University of Maryland and the National Institute of Dental and Craniofacial Research, Bethesda, Ma. She returned to Ireland in 2000 and established the only postgraduate training programme in Paediatric Dentistry in Ireland. She has numerous peer-reviewed publications in both basic science and clinical dentistry. Her areas of interest include cariology, traumatic oral injuries, developmental defects of the dentition, and advanced restorative treatment for children. O'Connell is renowned as speaker both nationally and internationally on these topics. She is also active on numerous national and international dental and scientific committees/organisations and is on the Scientific Committee of AAPD and the editorial board of many journals. She recently completed two terms on the Board of the International Association of Paediatric Dentistry, where she held office of Honorary Editor. She also maintains a part-time private practice limited to Paediatric Dentistry in Dublin.

As an Adolescent Medicine physician at Boston Children's Hospital, Dr. Rich founded and directs the first evidence-based medical program addressing health issues associated with digital technology, the Clinic for Interactive Media and Internet Disorders (CIMAID). As The Mediatrician®, Dr. Rich offers research-based, balanced and practical answers to parents', teachers', and

clinicians' questions about children's media use and the positive and negative implications for their health and development.

Dr. Rich came to medicine after a 12-year career as a filmmaker, including apprenticing to Akira Kurosawa as assistant director on Kagemusha. His experience and expertise in medicine and media synergize in his health research and clinical work. Dr. Rich earned his B.A. in English and Film from Pomona College, his M.D. from Harvard Medical School, and his M.P.H. from the Harvard T. H. Chan School of Public Health.

He completed his graduate degree in Biophysics with doctoral and post-doctoral training at the University of Alberta, University of California Berkeley, Los Alamos National Weapons Lab and Washington University in St. Louis. His clinical training was completed at the University of Alberta, Stanford University and Washington University in St. Louis, moving from St. Louis to Toronto in 2012. His research primarily involves finding new ways to quantify drug action, both therapeutic and toxic, including how to improve the clinical effect of anesthetics and pain medications.

His lab has developed new therapies for heart failure, modeling cardiac function using stem-cell derived tissue, and has created platform technologies that measure cardio-myocyte function for the purposes of drug discovery. He holds patents and intellectual property around new therapies for heart failure, novel methods for quantifying cardio-myocyte function and for anti-viral small molecule therapies. His lab is currently funded by the CIHR, NSERC, Canada Foundation for Innovation, The Ontario Research Fund and The Labatt Family Heart Center, in addition to funding from pharmaceutical and venture capital groups. He is a member of the CIHR College of Reviewers and is a member of the Scientific Boards for the Society for Pediatric Anesthesia and the Society of Cardiovascular Anesthesiologists.

A board-certified pediatric dentist, he is actively involved in teaching at all levels, clinical practice and research. He is an oral and genetic epidemiologist, with a research focus lying in the intersection of clinical, biological, and public health research for precision pediatric oral health applications. His NIH-funded research program includes genomics studies of early childhood caries, the oral microbiome, and integrative clinical and omics investigations. He has received several major awards and has had substantial scholarly and editorial activity. Currently, he studies the interplay between biological (i.e., multi-omics), behavioral, environmental and social determinants of early childhood caries in the context of a large, multi-ethnic, community-based cohort of preschool-age children in North Carolina.

He is the first author of AAPD's first-ever evidence-based dentistry systematic review: Systematic review and meta-analysis of vital pulp therapy for children with deep caries in the primary dentition. He is the chair of the non-vital systematic review and Guideline for non-vital primary teeth workgroup. This year he was the first author of A Systematic Review and Meta-Analysis of Nonvital Pulp Therapy for Primary Teeth published in Pediatr Dent 2020;42(4) and the Guideline, Use of Non-Vital Pulp Therapies in Primary Teeth, also published in 2020 in Pediatr Dent Pediatr Dent 2020;42(5).

Cohort Study on the Risk of Periodontitis Following Tonsillectomy for Children

Kevin Sheng-Kai Ma, D.D.S., M.Sc.

Tonsillectomy as a common procedure for pharyngotonsillitis and obstructive sleep apnea, has been shown to bring about long-term side effects such as irritable bowel syndrome, autoimmune diseases, deep neck infections, and other immune-related infectious diseases. We identified in a cohort study that pediatric patients undergoing tonsillectomy presented with higher risks of periodontitis. These findings support long-term dental follow-ups for children undergoing tonsillectomy.

Cultural Considerations in Parental Approval of Behavior Guidance Techniques in Current Times Fabio G. Arriola-Pacheco, M.Sc.

Shifts in population and migration, decades in the making, present an interesting contemporary context for the pediatric population in our practice. Behavioral conditions are an essential aspect of this diversification, and the current practitioner must be familiarized with adequate cultural competence and sensitivity skills to address this. This presentation seeks to shed light on the current context of parental approval of behavior guidance techniques to contextualize the importance of this in our contemporary practice.

Empathy of Dental Students Toward Children After Behavior Guidance Lectures and Clinical Experience Yasser Source, Ph.D.

The empathetic behavior of dentists is essential for perfect patient care. In this presentation, Souror will provide an overview of empathy concept and its application on the pediatric dentistry clinic. He will try to explain and think through, the possible decline of empathy of dental staff toward children.

Molar Incisor Hypomineralization (MIH) in Latin America: Sharing Experiences, Perceptions and Overcome Barriers Lourdes Santos-Pinto, Ph.D.

The prevalence of MIH varies considerably indicating differences in recognizing this enamel defect. The available treatment modalities for MIH ranging from prevention to extraction. Treatment decision making is complex and should consider the child's compliance, parent's social background, and expectation, occlusion, severity of hypomineralization, cost and the long-term prognosis of the teeth. As MIH is a serious problem for both, children and dentists, the focus of this presentation will be on MIH research and clinical challenges experienced in Latin America.

Pediatric Dentistry Treatment with a Cariogenic Risk Approach. A Child Care Experience

Eugenia D'A Henriquez-D'Aquino, D.D.S.

A treatment based on cariogenic risk allows us to understand the caries factors for a particular child; individualizes, selects and determines the frequency of preventive and rehabilitative treatment; and anticipates the progression or stabilization of the disease. Health education is part of this approach, allowing children to develop the concept of self-care so that they take care of themselves, that their families also get involved in order to strengthen positive habits, modify inappropriate behaviors, and acquire new healthy habits to maintain or achieve good oral health.

The Oral Health Experience of First Nations Children in Canada Sheri McKinstry, B.Sc., B.Sc.(Dent.), D.M.D., M.P.H., M.Dent/Dip.Paed.Dent., FRCDC-Provisional

Indigenous people of Canada is comprised of First Nations (Status or non-Status), Métis and Inuit. It is important to recognize the heterogeneity not only between groups, but also within groups with their own languages, cultures and traditions. This study explored the barriers and oral health experiences of First Nations children in Manitoba that presented to the clinic with early childhood caries, requiring dental rehabilitation under general anesthesia.

Tongue Involvement in Children's Occlusion: Ankyloglossia Sara R. Arcari, D.D.S.

The investigation of tongue function is an important part of oral diagnosis for pediatric dentists. Studies have demonstrated that tongue abnormal pressure plays a significant role in malocclusion etiology. Maxillofacial development is influenced by lingual frenulum: a shortness of it (ankyloglossia) causes limitation of protrusion and elevation of the tongue.


